# RESTART PLAN PHASES 3 & 4 COVID-19 PANDEMIC KINGCOME VILLAGE COMMUNITY

This Restart Plan is being implemented under the  
Dzawada'enuxw Pandemic By-law 01-2020

On March 16, 2020, the Dzawada'enuxw First Nation (DFN) Elected Council made the decision, based on recommendations from the Emergency Management Team (EMT), to implement safety precautions in an effort to safeguard the community from the novel COVID-19 virus.

The DFN Council later implemented a By-law, Dzawada'enuxw Pandemic Bylaw 01-2020, on April 20, 2020 for the same reasons.

While we acknowledge that we must all adapt to a 'new normal,' the following phases will outline how we, the DFN Organization and DFN Community, will continue to move forward through these uncertain times together.

***This Document is subject to changes as we move through the phases and outcomes of the COVID-19 Virus.***

***Following the words of Doctor Bonnie Henry, Provincial Health Officer of BC:***

Our “new normal” is based on principles that apply to every person and every situation. These principles are the foundation of how we need to move forward with our BC plan, and will remain in place for the weeks and months ahead. These principles include:

1. Staying informed, being prepared and following public health advice;
2. Practising good hygiene – hand hygiene, avoid touching your face and respiratory etiquette;
3. Staying at home and away from others if you are feeling ill – with no exceptions – whether for school, work or socializing;
4. Maintaining physical distancing outside the household, e.g., no handshakes or hugs, keeping your number of contacts low and keeping a safe distance;
5. Making necessary contacts safer with appropriate controls, e.g., using plexiglass barriers or redesigning spaces;
6. Increasing cleaning of frequently touched surfaces at home and work;
7. Considering the use of non-medical masks in situations where physical distancing cannot be maintained, such as on transit or while shopping; and,
8. Continuing to minimize non-essential personal travel. I have seen the strength and resilience in British Columbians that I know will hold us in good stead in the months ahead. We must continue to keep our firewall strong and remain committed to our efforts to protect our province.

**Phase 3 – If Transmission Rate remains low or is on the Decline**

**Travel in Phase 3**

Normal Travel is accepted.

**Social**

Careful Social Contact and the use of face masks is recommended.

### Quarantine

Quarantine is required if residents travelling, have come in to contact with a person (s) who have been confirmed to have either been in contact with a covid19 positive case or are covid19 positive themselves. Quarantine is also required for a 14-day period should symptoms arise at any time during the social distancing period of 14 days after returning to community.

- It is your responsibility to arrange to have all grocery and freight delivered to your home. All household members will remain indoors until the drop off is completed and the delivery person has left the premises.
- You are required to remain in your house and your yard only for 14 days.
- Should you feel any symptoms that may be COVID-19 related, please contact the DFN Health Director, Charlene Dawson or the Community Health Nurse at (250)974-5543.
- All members of your household will need to Quarantine regardless if they were out of community or not.

### Community General

Regular community functions and events such as community dinners, Community Feasts, cultural activities, and family feasts are acceptable. The use of PPE is recommended for attendance at the events with attendees present that are not a part of other family circles. Continue with established safety guidelines when visiting in the homes such as maintain sanitizing, handwashing etc.

Normal Visitation to other family or friends' households is permitted on the understanding that every member of each household is feeling well and have no symptoms of COVID-19. Continue with established safety guidelines when visiting in the homes such as maintain sanitizing, handwashing etc.

### **Playground**

Children must use an antibacterial soap on their hands before and after playing on the equipment. Everyone at the playground must practice careful social contact as often as possible.

### **Groceries and other incoming Freight**

It is strongly recommended that any incoming freight from out of community be sanitized before entering your home because we do not know where these products came from.

### **Boats Meeting Planes and Water Taxi's/Vehicles Meeting River Boats**

It is recommended for boat and vehicle owner/operators to wear PPE while meeting planes and boats as well as transporting freight and people.

### **External Essential Service Providers**

Applicable protocols are to be followed by each department that have external essential service providers entering the community. Notifying the community of these services, dates of arrival, length of stay etc. is required.

Upon entry to the community, social distancing of a minimum of 6 feet is required from the rest of the community. PPE are to be kept on hand during movement throughout the community i.e., Trails, beaches, roads etc. if contact is unavoidable with other members of the community or DFN Personnel.

### **Administration and Office Workers**

The DFN Departments have their own protocols which are posted on the buildings at every entrance.

### **Non-Resident Travel**

Non-Residents are permitted to enter community. Requests for travel can be submitted using the COVID-19 Travel Form & should be submitted to the DFN Council with 5 days' notice of date of travel.

Travelers must include the following:

- Date of arrival;
- Names of all persons travelling.

Upon entry to the community, safe social contact is required of the travelers and the members of the household in which they are residing, it is recommended that masks are used during community movement.

Travelers are expected to produce proof of vaccination which is to be attached to their travel forms.

Anyone who has not been vaccinated, is expected to practice social distancing as well as wear PPE while in community. This also applies to the household and its members of which the travelers are staying.

NOTE: Travel is not permitted if any of the travelers have tested positive for Covid19 or were in contact with another person(s) who were tested positive, a minimum of 14 days before intended entry to community.

**Phase 4 - CONDITIONAL ON AT LEAST ONE OF: WIDE VACCINATION; "COMMUNITY" IMMUNITY; BROAD SUCCESSFUL TREATMENTS.**

**Activities such as but not limited to:**


- Large Gatherings of Resident and Non-Residents (Potlatches, Heritage event, sporting events etc.);
- Local Tourism;
- Non-resident visitors from any location not exposed to high-risk covid19 numbers, as well no exposure within two weeks or more of high-risk location, prior to entering the territory and community.

Daily life of all aspects will return to normal.


